RESEARCH FOCUS

I am a pediatric health services and clinical researcher with an overall mission to improve access to healthcare, quality of care, and health outcomes for children. I have concentrated my own research on improving the *delivery of healthcare in primary care and other settings* in three related areas: *immunization delivery, healthcare financing, and improved care for children with chronic diseases*.

Immunization delivery: In collaboration with many others, my studies helped refocus the nation on primary care practices for vaccinations, contributed to improving vaccine financing through the Vaccines for Children Program (VFC), led to national guidelines for standards of care (e.g., patient reminder/recall) for vaccine delivery in medical homes, and helped lead to ACIP/AAP/AAFP recommendations for new vaccines or new vaccine policies such as universal influenza vaccination for children. Our clinical research studies have contributed to understanding the burden of vaccine-preventable diseases for new vaccines or future vaccines (e.g., norovirus) and to recommendations for rotavirus vaccine. My recent work has helped focus the US on three new areas in immunizations: adolescent vaccinations (particularly HPV vaccine), school-located influenza vaccination, and use of technology (e.g., EHRs, statewide immunization registries) to improve vaccination rates.

Healthcare financing: In collaboration with a different set of researchers, my studies on healthcare financing for children contributed heavily to the passage of the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) in 1998, the SCHIP reauthorization debate in 2008, the *Children's Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2009* (CHIPRA), and the recent reauthorization of CHIP in 2015.

Improved care for children with chronic diseases: In collaboration with local and national colleagues, our studies have led to improved financing of primary care for children with special healthcare needs; enhanced care of children with asthma in medical homes and schools; a focus on mental health and developmental problems, child obesity, and child hypertension, and an emerging focus on identification, management, and prevention of toxic stress. The common thread is improved primary care and integration of care for high-prevalence chronic conditions in children.

A second major theme of my research career is to mentor others in health services and in clinical research. I spend considerable effort mentoring faculty and fellows in the Department of Pediatrics and other departments. Most studies involve improving the organization and delivery of healthcare for children and families in general and for those with chronic diseases. I am co-director of the Special Populations component of UCLA's CTSI, along with Catherine Sarkisian MD MPH, and lead for the child health research components of the CTSI. I am also very involved with community engagement components of the CTSI, and help junior faculty and trainees in pediatric and community-based research. I devote considerable effort in helping to bridge the academic enterprise with improved public health.

A third major theme of my career has been to make measurable improvements in community and public health through dissemination and implementation. I have led community-wide programs to measurably improve immunization delivery and worked nationally on task forces and committees to enhance immunization delivery and health insurance. For example, in December 2014 I was appointed by the US Comptroller General as a Commissioner to MACPAC which directly advises Congress and the Secretary of DHHS on Medicaid and CHIP. Through my national leadership within the Academic Pediatric Association, editorship of the journal *Academic Pediatrics* and co-editorship of the *Bates Guide to Physical Examination and History Taking*, I have promoted dissemination and implementation of evidence-based care for children.
