### UCLA Health Installs Cutting Edge Treatment System ViewRay MRIDian Linear Accelerator



In November 2019, the Department of Radiation Oncology treated its first cancer patient with the newly upgraded Viewray Linear Accelerator System in 200 Medical Plaza, Suite B265. The machine installation required extensive coordination and teamwork to upgrade lead shielding, update structural steel beams to support the weight of the new machine and safety precautions to ignite the magnet. UCLA Health is one of few hospitals in the world to install this cutting edge technology.

### Department of Radiology Upgrades MRI to HIFU/InSightec Improves Patient Care and Experience

The Department of Real Estate | Planning, Design and Construction successfully completed construction and replaced the existing Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) machine in Suite B165-78 on the basement level of 200 Medical Plaza. The new MRI allows for the addition of Neuro High Intensity Focused Ultrasound (HIFU) to the existing Uterine Fibroid and Prostate HIFU programs. The completed project improves the existing MRI room with related control and equipment rooms, supply storage, patient waiting area, dressing rooms and restrooms. Upgrades also include the Waste Anesthetic Gas Disposal (WAGD) and VAC system.

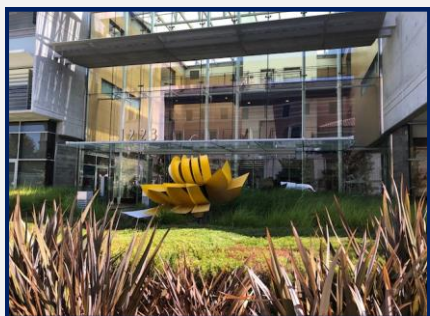


### Construction Update RRUMC 7<sup>th</sup> Floor Coronary Care Unit



Construction is underway at RRUMC 7N to convert Sleep Room # 7633 to another CCU bed. The renovation is part of UCLA’s Health’s commitment to maintain exceptional patient care and smooth clinical operations when the hospital is at full capacity. Construction is approximately 70% complete. During the month of December, the focus will be on finishes and critical care items such as medical gas supply, headwall installation, steam, dialysis and nurse call. Construction completion is scheduled for January 2020 by which the Department of Planning, Design and Construction will hand over the project to UCLA Health Clinical Regulatory Affairs to license the space.

### Sugarman Art Titled “Five Points” Installed Outside SMMOB

Patients and staff can now enjoy the newly installed “Five Points” art sculpture by George Sugarman located outside 1223 16th Street of the Santa Monica MOB. The piece was sculpted in 1991 and donated to UCLA Health in 2007. George Sugarman (1912-1999), was a prolific, controversial, and forward-thinking American artist whose sculptures, drawings, and paintings defy definition. Sugarman art is featured all over the country including the New York City Museum of Modern Art and in Switzerland, Texas as well as Harvard University.

## OFF CAMPUS UPDATE:

### Project Complete Burbank Cardiology Clinic

In August 2019, UCLA Health opened its latest Cardiology Clinic located at 2625 W. Alameda Ave. Suite 102 in Burbank for patient care.

Approximately 2,000 SF of renovated space includes seven exam rooms, one stress echo room, a laboratory, physician and support office space, reception and waiting area. The clinic also features convenient access due to its location on the first floor and joins other specialties at this UCLA Health location including Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Dermatology, Endocrinology, Hematology / Oncology and Urology.



### Clinic Expansion in Progress Westfield Shopping Center Century City

The Primary and Urgent Care Clinic located at 10250 Santa Monica Blvd. in Suite 2440 at the Westfield Century City Mall is expanding. Current specialties at the 5,447 SF clinic include Family Medicine, Internal Medicine and Pediatrics. An additional 3,800 SF will provide six exam rooms and clinical imaging equipment including Ultrasound, Mammography, Bone Density as well as Physical Therapy. The expansion is scheduled to open for patient care January 2020.
