1. Jose Aliling, MD	Clinical Instructor	Available daily in Thousand Oaks outpatient clinic, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology.
2. Roy Altman, MD	Emeritus Professor of Medicine	Immediate past Editor of Seminars in Arthritis and Rheumatism and currently editor of Osteoarthritis and Cartilage. Available to teach fellows 3 days per week and has monthly reviews of the ACR Slide collection with all the Fellows. He is a Master of ACR.
3. Ernest Brahn, MD	Training Program Director; Professor of Medicine	Available in one ½ day clinic a week, teaches in the Fellow's clinic and 2 to 3 rotations a year on the inpatient consultative service. Heads Rheumatology Grand Rounds which is designed to train fellows in the fundamentals of Rheumatology practice and sciences. He Chairs the Committee on Fellowship Selection. Conducts quarterly interviews with each fellow, twice-yearly meetings of the fellowship committee, annual retreat to discuss fellowship.
4. Christina Charles, MD, MS	Associate Professor of Medicine	Clinical Investigator. Available to teach one ½ day clinic a week, 1 to 2 inpatient rotations a year, teaches in Fellow's Clinic. Received MS from the UCLA Masters Program in Clinical Investigation. Supported by ACR-REF Clinical Investigator Fellowship Award and Arthritis Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowship and NIH R01.
5. Pojen Chen, PhD	Emeritus Professor of Medicine	Bench Research in anti-phospholipid. Has participated in training of two current faculty members. Is training two postdoctoral students and a medical student.
6. Soo Choi, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine	Clinician Educator. Available daily in outpatient clinics and teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology and in Fellow's Clinic.
7. Benedict Chou, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Available to teach in outpatient clinic and inpatient rotations.
8. Philip Clements, MD	Emeritus Professor of Medicine	Clinical Research/Clinician. Works every day on scleroderma clinical investigations and teaches in clinics he supervises. Fellows frequently elect one or more months in his scleroderma clinical trial group. Co-editor of the textbook Systemic Sclerosis.

9. Alan Gorn, MD	Clinical Professor of Medicine	Clinician Educator. Available daily in outpatient clinics and teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology. Weekly lectures to fellows, residents, and medical students in rheumatology. Director of Fellow's Continuity Clinic.
10. Jennifer Grossman, MD	Clinical Professor; Director, Lupus Clinical Investigation	Available to teach 4-½ day clinics a week, 2 to 3 inpatient rotations a year, teaches in Fellow's Clinic. Director of Lupus Clinical Trials Group.
11. Meika Fang, MD	Clinical Professor of Medicine	Clinician Educator. Based at West Los Angeles VA Medical Center. Trains Fellows in ½ day clinic at VA each week and on multiple rotations on inpatient consultations at the VA per year. Also coordinates the Fellows outpatient rotation through the VA's.
12. John FitzGerald, MD, PhD	Acting Chief of Rheumatology, Director, Rheumatology Medical Group; Clinical Professor of Medicine	Teaches in the Fellow's clinic. Mentored 3 fellows in the ACR Guidelines for the Treatment of Gout project and 2 fellows for the Evidence Report for the ACR Guidelines on Musculoskeletal Ultrasound.
13. Daniel Furst, MD	Emeritus Professor of Medicine	Has trained 3 current faculty in which all 3 completed Master's degree program in Clinical Investigation, Co-mentored 1 fellow who received the Southern California Scleroderma Foundation Fellowship Award and mentored 3 fellows on the ACR Task Force Panel on Evidenced Based Guidelines on Using Biologics in RA and update of the RA Guidelines. Currently mentoring 3 Junior Faculty who completed UCLA fellowship program in RA and Scleroderma clinical investigation. Co-editor of the textbook Systemic Sclerosis.
14. Bevra H. Hahn, MD	Emeritus Professor of Medicine	Teaches in fellows clinic.. Available for advanced clinical training in SLE research and bench training in immune tolerance and autoimmune T cell biology. Currently training two Junior Faculty who completed fellowship at UCLA – one in bench research and two in clinical investigation. Editor of Dubois' SLE Textbook, past president of ACR and ACR Gold Medal recipient.
15. Suzanne Kafaja, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Available to teach two ½ day clinics in Westwood. Clinical/bench research. Attends Fellow's Clinic monthly. Clinical and Bench Scleroderma Researcher
16. Marian Kaldas, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Clinician Educator. Available for ½ day clinic once weekly in Westwood and teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology and in Fellow's Clinic.

17. George Karpouzas, MD	Associate Professor of Medicine	Chief of Rheumatology at Harbor/UCLA . Works with Fellows when they rotate on inpatient and outpatient services, covers 1/3 of clinic and inpatient consult rotations at Harbor during the year. Received Arthritis Foundation Meyers Award for bench research in systemic lupus.
18. Tanaz Kermani, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine	Available daily in Santa Monica outpatient clinic, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology.
19. Jennifer King, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Bench Research in Systemic Lupus Erythematosus. Recipient of Rheumatology NIH T32 Training Grant and the ACR Physician Scientist Fellowship Award. Available to teach one ½ day clinic a week, and teaches in Fellow's Clinic. During her fellowship training at UCLA, she was on the ACR National Fellows Committee that helped create the "Roadmap for Fellows" resource tool, available on the ACR website. In 2009, she was also selected as one of the ACR Distinguished Fellows.
20. Antonio La Cava, MD, PhD	Professor in Residence of Medicine	Bench Research in molecular immunology. Has established a laboratory in autoimmunity in animal models of SLE and diabetes. Gives journal clubs, research conferences, available for training fellows in bench/translational research.
21. James Louie, MD	Emeritus Professor of Medicine	Available to teach two ½ day clinic a week and teaches in Fellow's Clinic. He is a Master of the ACR.
22. Megan Lynch, MD	Clinical Instructor	Available daily in Santa Monica outpatient clinic, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology.
23. William Martin, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Available to teach in Santa Monica outpatient clinic, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology.
24. Maureen McMahon, MD, MS	Associate Clinical Professor	Clinical/Bench Investigator. Available to teach one ½ day clinic a week, 2 to 3 inpatient rotations a year, teaches in Fellow's Clinic. Received MS from the UCLA Masters Program in Clinical Investigation. Supported by ACR Lupus Research Investigator Fellowship Award and is the recipient of 2006 Arthritis Foundation Arthritis Investigator Award and NIH K23 Award, and now NIH R01.
25. Gopika Miller, MD	Assistant Clinician Professor	Available to teach in outpatient clinic and inpatient rotations at Harbor.
26. Masoom Modi, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Teaches in Fellow's Clinic.
27. Geraldine Navarro, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Available to teach ½ day clinic a week in Westwood. Teaches in Fellow's Clinic.

28. Harold Paulus, MD	Emeritus Professor of Medicine	Works most days on RA clinical investigation, teaches in the Fellow's clinic, mentors 2 current junior faculty in RA clinical and health services investigation. Heads the Western Consortium of Practicing Rheumatologists and established the RA response criteria which were later adapted as the ACR 20/50/70. He is a Master of the ACR.
29. Jay Persselin, MD	Clinical Professor of Medicine	Chief of Rheumatology at West Los Angeles VA Medical Center. Clinician educator. Covers ½ of clinics at VA and ½ of inpatient clinical rotations per year. Compiles reading list and reviews ACR teaching slides with Fellows. Supervises training program in Rehabilitation.
30. Veena Ranganath, MD, MS	Associate Clinical Professor	Clinical Investigator. Available to teach one ½ day clinic a week, 2 to 3 inpatient rotations a year, teaches in Fellow's Clinic. Received MS from UCLA Masters Program in Clinical Investigation. Supported by ACR ASP Junior Career Development Award in Geriatric Medicine and ACR Clinical Investigator Award. Current support includes NIH K award.
31. Rania Shammam, MD	Assistant Clinical; Professor	Available daily in Burbank outpatient clinic, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology.
32. Man Shim, MD	Clinical Instructor	Available daily in Beverly Hills outpatient clinic, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology.
33. Ram Raj Singh, MD	Professor of Medicine, Pathology, and of Interdepartmental Molecular Toxicology; Director of Rheumatology Translational Research Program	Bench research. Mentored/mentoring 5 rheumatology fellows, 1 pediatric rheumatology fellow, 4 graduate students, 1 MD/PhD (Medical Scientist Training Program) and over 30 postdoc researchers, who have garnered over 50 grant/research awards in the last three years, including NIH K01, K08, K12, R03, F31, F30, Re-entry and Diversity Supplement training grants, NIH T32, Rheumatology Research Foundation Investigator Award and Rheumatology Scientist Development Award, Arthritis Foundation Fellowship and Clinic-To-Research-Transition Awards.

35. Mihaela Taylor, MD	Clinical Professor of Medicine	Clinician. Co-Director of Clinical Rheumatology, UCLA-Santa Monica Hospital. Available daily in outpatient clinics, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology and musculoskeletal ultrasound.
36. Elizabeth Volkmann, MD	Assistant Clinical Professor	Clinical Investigator. Available to teach two ½ day clinics. Does 2 Inpatient rotations per year, and Fellow's Clinic.
37. Melissa Wang, MD	Clinical Instructor	Available daily in Torrance outpatient clinic, teaches inpatient consultation in rheumatology.
38. Ari Weinreb, MD, PhD	Associate Clinical Professor of Medicine	Clinician Educator and Bench Research. Based at West Los Angeles VA. Completed STAR program with PhD in Genetics in 1999. Has an independent lab in genetics of atherosclerosis at VA. Trains Fellows in ½ day clinic at VA each week and on multiple rotations on inpatient consultations at the VA per year.
