MORNING PLENARY KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Eileen M. Sullivan-Marx, PhD, RN, FAAN

Immediate Past President, American Academy of Nursing Dean & Erline Perkins McGriff Professor, New York University Rory Meyers College of Nursing

Dr. Sullivan-Marx has served as the Dean of the Rory Meyers College of Nursing from 2012-2023 during which she led the school to its now independent status as a college, growing its national reputation as a leader in nursing research, establishing a new home for the college of nursing, raising \$50 million including a naming gift for the college.



As an expert in medical payment models, Medicare and Medicaid policy, her research demonstrated how innovative care models can be sustained. As an expert in aging issues she has had extensive experience in city, state and federal commissions and nonprofit boards. She led the prestigious American Academy of Nursing as president during the COVID-19 pandemic while also chairing NYU's Deans Council.

Dr. Sullivan-Marx had an active practice career in community and hospital nursing before becoming a primary care nurse practitioner in 1980 at the University of Rochester. As an NP she established numerous NP roles in aging care and opened her own primary care practice in a rural area in 1988. At Penn, she oversaw the growth and success of a Program for All Inclusive Care for Elders (PACE) in West Philadelphia. She received her diploma, BSN, and PhD from the University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing. Dr. Sullivan-Marx holds adjunct faculty positions at Howard University and the University of Pennsylvania.

Linda L. Chlan, PhD, RN, ATSF, FAANAssociate Dean for Nursing Research, Mayo Clinic

Dr. Linda Chlan is the Associate Dean for Nursing Research with responsibilities to lead Mayo Clinic nursing research across all campuses. In addition to her administrative role, Dr. Chlan maintains an active program of extramurally supported research focused on developing and testing symptom

management interventions for critically ill patients receiving mechanical ventilatory support funded by the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute and the National Institute on Aging, National Institutes of Health. She is a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing and a Fellow of the American Thoracic Society. She was inducted into the Sigma Theta Tau International Nursing Honor Society's international nursing research Hall of Fame in recognition for the impact of her science.




MAP AND DIRECTIONS TO UCLA COVEL COMMONS



DRIVING DIRECTIONS (from the 405 FWY)

- 1. EXIT on Sunset Blvd. and head EAST.
- 2. RIGHT on Bellagio Dr.
- 3. LEFT onto De Neve Dr. After 3/10 of a mile, look for the PSV or SV (Sunset Village) parking structure on the right (before 2nd stop sign). Parking structure address is 330 De Neve Dr.
- 4. PARK and pay for permit at kiosk in PSV parking structure. Up to \$12 for all-day parking. Place permit on your dashboard. (NOTE: Do not park in Blue Permit areas.)
- 5. TAKE the elevators/stairs to the Lobby Level (L1).
- 6. WALK towards the right to the building's main entrance. The Grand Horizon Ballroom is on the 3rd floor.
