## State-of-the-Art

This course explores the most challenging management problems facing the practicing  $\cal U$  urologist. Distinguished faculty present current information and techniques in female urology, reconstructive surgery, overactive bladder, incontinence, management of renal stones, endourology, laparoscopy and robotics, urologic oncology (including kidney, prostate, bladder, and testis cancer), medical and surgical therapy for BPH, testosterone replacement therapy, erectile dysfunction, and pediatric urology. The conference emphasizes interaction between participants and faculty and allows ample time for case presentations and group discussions, ensuring an outstanding educational experience for attendees.
