Advanced Fellowships

There are vacancies in the VA GLA GRECC Advanced Geriatrics fellowship for the 2025-2026 academic year. MD's and other doctoral level clinicians are eligible for the Advanced Geriatrics fellowship; fellows can begin later in the year. Please contact Homero del Pino regarding potential candidates.

One of our current geriatrics fellows will be an incoming NCSP fellow starting in July. The incoming VA health services research fellows include two post-doctoral nurses, a family medicine physician, an emergency medicine physician and a surgery resident.

The National Clinician Scholars Program (NCSP) had a retreat with community partners, the deans of the schools of medicine, nursing, and public health, co-director for RAND Health, President and CEO of Charles Drew, and representatives from AltaMed, Healthy African American Families, and Cedars Research. Researcher Spotlight: Dr Peifeng (Perry) Hu

Dr. Perry Hu is a clinician scientist with PhD training in Epidemiology and clinical fellowship training in Geriatric Medicine, both from UCLA. He joined our division as a faculty member in 2001. Since then, his research focus has been on the relationships of psychosocial factors with biomarkers and hard clinical outcomes in older adults. He has led biomarker measurements and the harmonized diagnostic assessment of dementia in multiple large, community-based, nationally representative, cohort studies in several countries, including the Longitudinal Aging Study in India (LASI), the China Health and Retirement Longitudinal Study (CHARLS), and the Indonesia Family Life Survey (IFLS).

Through these studies, Dr. Hu has investigated the impact of socioeconomic conditions at the individual, community, and national levels on health and functioning of individual older adults, as these countries undergo rapid economic development. For example, LASI Dynamic Assessment of Dementia (LASI-DAD) team has conducted two waves of cognitive measurements, geriatric assessments, and venous blood-based assays beta-amyloids, tau

proteins, and cardiometabolic risk factors. This study has also collected extensive data on whole genome sequencing, DNA methylation (epigenetics), proteomics, neuroimaging, air pollution, and diet.

Dr. Hu's newest research project is the Longitudinal Study of Health and Ageing in Kenya, which is soon to launch, in collaboration with investigators from the University of Michigan and the Aga Khan University in Kenya. He is excited to be soon visiting Africa.
