

### In Honor of Black History Month: Statement from the UCLA Department of Surgery

February is Black History Month and the UCLA Department of Surgery honors and celebrates the significant and life-changing contributions of Black Americans to this nation and to the field of surgery. Dr. Vivien T. Thomas was one of many such pioneers (See accompanying Bio). We acknowledge the struggles and sacrifices Black Americans encounter to achieve equity and inclusion in our country's history and present day. As an evolving surgical community, it is our responsibility to respect, listen and learn from our history and take intentional steps to create an environment where diversity is sought and celebrated, and all individuals are valued and embraced equitably. We realize that concrete actions and not solely words are required to achieve this goal and we strongly pledge our commitment to uphold these principles.



Vivien Theodore Thomas, MD (1910-1985): Without any education past high school, Thomas rose above poverty and racism to become a cardiac surgery pioneer and a teacher of operative techniques to many of the country's most prominent surgeons. As a surgical technician, Thomas developed the procedures used to treat blue baby syndrome in the 1940's. He was the assistant to surgeon Alfred Blalock, MD, in Blalock's experimental animal laboratory at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Despite developing pioneering techniques which ushered in the era of modern pediatric heart surgery, racial discrimination prevented him from attending medical school. He was awarded an honorary doctorate from Johns Hopkins University in 1976 and remains a legendary figure in American surgery.

# **UCLA Intramural Seed Grant Opportunities**

Latinx Studies Seed Grants As part of the HSI Infrastructure Initiative, the Chicano Studies Research Center in collaboration with the Office of Research and Creative Activities (ORCA) will administer a new seed funding program (\$250,000) designed to help launch and support research projects on and/or involving Latinx populations in the US.

Racial and Social Justice Seed Grants As part of the Rising to the Challenge initiative, the Institute for American Cultures in collaboration with the Office for Research and Creative Activities (ORCA) will administer \$250,000 in seed research grants on topics addressing racial inequities and racial justice.

<u>Iransdisciplinary Research Acceleration Grants</u> Seed funding is available to catalyze transdisciplinary research and creative activities by supporting early stage projects with the specific goal of facilitating investigators' chances for attaining extramural funding. Proposals must represent a research collaboration from at least two distinctly different disciplines, with preference given to projects led by a "north campus" Pl and/or projects that advance diversity, equity, and inclusion within the research enterprise.

All grants will be up to \$30,000. Applications due on 3/23. Info: <u>orcafunding@conet.ucla.edu</u>.
