



## **Course Description**

The UCLA Gender Health Program presents an up-to-date, in-depth compendium of gender-affirming medical care. This course will feature sessions on developing an informed gender-affirming care program, basic and advanced hormone therapy, navigation through the gender-affirming surgical process, complex considerations in behavioral health care, and considerations for youth and older patients. This conference will be presented by members of the integrated, multidisciplinary UCLA Gender Health Program, and will also feature a panel of community members with diverse backgrounds and experiences. Our invited guest speaker, Eli Coleman, PhD, Chair of the WPATH SOC8, will provide an in-depth update on the WPATH Standards of Care, Version 8 (SOC8). The conference programming will be conducted in a live, hybrid format (in-person or virtual). The program will be delivered in topic-specific sessions and breakout roundtable discussions, each followed by a brief question and answer opportunity. For in-person attendees, lunch and a post-conference reception will be included as will scheduled breaks for networking and informal discussion.

## **Course Objectives**

At the completion of this program, participants should be better able to:

- Create a welcoming and inclusive environment for patients of all gender identities
- Describe the various approaches to patient-centered gender-affirming hormone therapy
- Support patients through the gender-affirming surgical process, including mental and physical health assessment and optimization, and identification and management of common postoperative concerns
- Navigate the updated Standards of Care (Version 8) from the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH)
- Describe unique considerations in the care of children, adolescents and older adults with gender-diverse identities

## **Target Audience**

This program is a continuation of our ongoing series intended to provide a more in-depth exposure to interdisciplinary care for gender diverse patients. The program is intended for an audience of physicians, nurses and other allied health professionals in primary care, endocrinology, plastic surgery, urology, obstetrics/gynecology and other medical disciplines, as well as psychologists, social workers and other mental health disciplines. Trainees and students from each are also welcome to register.
