UCLA State-of-the-Art Urology

This course explores the most challenging management problems facing the practicing urologist. Distinguished faculty present current information and techniques in urologic oncology (prostate, bladder, kidney), male and female voiding dysfunction, incontinence, urinary tract infections, BPH surgical therapies, neurogenic bladder, mini-perc for kidney stones, kidney stone prevention, disposable scopes, androgen deficiency, prevention and management of penile prosthesis complications, prostate cancer focal and radiation therapy, perineal prostate biopsy, active surveillance, genetic testing, advanced prostate cancer therapy, robotic surgery, BCG refractory bladder cancer, upper tract TCCA, renal tumors, pediatric urology, practice management, GU dermatology, and trauma. The conference emphasizes interaction between participants and faculty and allows ample time for case presentations and group discussions, ensuring an outstanding educational experience for attendees.


