



PELVIC PAIN CLINIC AT WEST MEDICAL




For the past 20 years, the West Medical clinic has been proud to offer one of the first multidisciplinary pelvic pain clinics for women with chronic pelvic pain. Dr. Rapkin chose the setting of this clinic for these important reasons:

- 1. The clinic has a special interdisciplinary team including an anesthesiologist with training in both Anesthesiology and Obstetrics and Gynecology and who performs complex nerve blocks, a clinical psychologist with crucial experience in cognitive behavioral pain management and when feasible, a pelvic floor physical therapist.
- 2. The West Med clinic has a very responsive, compassionate and well organized staff with an excellent track record of taking care of the underserved population in West Los Angeles and beyond.
- 3. The clinic also offers women with vulvodynia the opportunity to participate in several NIH funded studies that will further our understanding and management the difficult problem of vulvodynia.

4. The clinic is an important teaching facility where OBGYN residents and medical students learn to evaluate patients with complex pelvic pain complaints and appreciate an in-depth multi-platform approach to the diagnosis and management of chronic pelvic and vulvar pain disorders.




