Southern California Environmental Health Sciences Center

The Environmental Health Centers at USC are a group of researchers looking at ways that pollution and toxic exposures in the environment affect health. Our most recently funded center, the Maternal and Developmental Risks from Environmental and Social Stressors (MADRES) is studying pregnant women and their infants over time in low-income, urban minority communities in Los Angeles that have both high obesity rates and wide-ranging exposure to environmental pollutants. The research team is in the process of recruiting 750 mother-infant pairs from prenatal clinics at LAC+USC Medical Center and Eisner Pediatric & Family Medical Center. Alongside the research team, the community engagement team will work closely with community-based organizations to understand the environmental concerns of mothers, share scientific information with local families and conduct workshops on decreasing exposure to environmental toxins.
